

# Download Moral Constraints On War : Principles And Cases

Principles of war are rules and guidelines that represent truths in the practice of war and military operations.. The earliest known principles of war were documented by Sun Tzu, circa 500 BCE. Machiavelli published his "General Rules" in 1521 which were themselves modeled on Vegetius' *Regulae bellorum generales* (Epit. 3.26.1-33). Henri, Duke of Rohan established his "Guides" for war in 1644. Just war theory (Latin: *jus bellum justum*) is a doctrine, also referred to as a tradition, of military ethics studied by military leaders, theologians, ethicists and policy makers. The purpose of the doctrine is to ensure war is morally justifiable through a series of criteria, all of which must be met for a war to be considered just. The criteria are split into two groups: "right to go to war ... Thomas Hobbes: Moral and Political Philosophy. The English philosopher Thomas Hobbes (1588-1679) is best known for his political thought, and deservedly so. The study of law is largely the study of history. The law of war is no different.
